## CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE FOR PORTABLE EXPLOSIVE MAGAZINES.

Three portable explosive magazines that are manufactured by your company and have been submitted for examination and consideration as to their compliance with the requirements of Australian Standard 2187.1 Explosives – Storage, Transport and use.

Item Number	Capacity	Timber Lining	Locking Mechanism
Tsm 250	250 L	Completely Satisfactory	Equal to or Better Than Six Lever Device required by the standard.
Tsm 470	470L	Completely Satisfactory	Equal to or Better Than Six Lever Device required by the standard.
Security Cabinet	Single or Double door	Completely Satisfactory	Equal to or Better Than Six Lever Device required by the standard.

### NOTE,

A copy of the installation requirements as shown below should be provided to each and every person who purchases a magazine.

The requirements for Portable Magazine to store explosives are as follows;

## 2.2 PORTABLE MAGAZINES

### 2.2.1 General Portable magazines used for storage and kept in a building shall

- (a) be stored on the ground floor close to an exterior door (for easy removal in case of fire) and not less than 5 m from goods of a corrosive, combustible or flammable nature;
- (b) have the location clearly identified with a sign stating 'EXPLOSIVES' or 'DETONATORS' and fixed at a height visible from an exterior door; and
- (c) have provision for the separate storage of-
  - (i) all explosives, detonating cord, boosters and primers which are not or do not contain detonators;
  - (ii) detonators, detonating relays and capped fuses; and
  - (iii) safety fuses, fuse igniters, multiple fuse igniters, igniter cords, igniter cord connectors and electric igniters.

In addition, portable magazines containing detonators shall be separated from portable magazines containing other blasting explosives by a safety distance of not less than 3 m (see Clause 3.2 of AS 2187.1).

**Locking Mechanism.**

The door(s) or lid(s) of every magazine shall be fitted with a six lever 'safe lock' or equivalent.
